FamilySearch.org:

If you haven't visited FamilySearch.org, the free genealogy site run by the Family History Library of the Church of Latter Day Saints, then you should hurry over. The site now offers a basic version of the features of the commercial Ancestry.ca, but everything is free. Also they have entered into an agreement with the Archives of Ontario which means that free images of the vital statistics records held by the Archives are now available on the site, and these images are almost always better in quality than the ones offered, as part of a subscription, by Ancestry.ca because they are made directly from the original paper documents, rather than from the often mediocre quality microfilm as the Ancestry.ca images were made. Many original registrations that are illegible on Ancestry.ca are clear on FamilySearch.org because the contrast has not been exaggerated. And there are fewer vignetting problems, which on the microfilm make some parts of the image too dark to see the details.

Methodology for Creating a Complete Family Tree

Ancestry.ca claims to have family trees including millions of individuals. However as you access those trees you will find that many individuals are replicated across dozens of supposedly independent family trees. This is because information has been copied between trees, frequently by inexperienced users who are not skeptical enough of information on the web. After all there are lots of people who fall for the old "Nigerian diamonds" scam, and unjustifiable conclusions about family trees are much subtler to debunk. The issue is how can you tell whether you have extracted all of the relevant information from any particular source? That is the focus of this site. For example:

There are two measurements of completeness that appear in this report. One is the measurement of the completion of the transcription of the death registrations from the original document images, and the second is the percentage of transcribed death registrations that have been linked to individuals in the family tree. If both of those are 100% then the project has extracted all of the information available from this type of document with respect to a particular town or township. If either of the numbers are low, then we have a place to focus out attention on.

In my own research I work in alternating stages. In odd numbered stages I focus on transcribing and linking a particular set of source documents, where appropriate adding individuals into the family tree

in order to be able to add a link. For example each birth registration or line in a census obviously creates an opportunity to add a child to a family. Sometime that is also true of a death registration. For example last week I came across the death of a [James F. Minor \(about 1849—25 December 1883\)](#). Although there was no family information associated with this death registration the unusual surname clearly tied him to the family of [David Peter Minor](#) and [Margaret Hudson](#). This filled in a gap because I have been unable to find any evidence of this family between their marriage in 1843 and its presence in the 1871 census of Caradoc, where the eldest child still living with the parents was born in 1856. It was highly unlikely that the couple had no children during the first 13 years of their marriage.

In the even stage I try to fill out the information available on each of the individuals I added, in particular searching for appearance in censuses, marriages, and children. As I add new spouses I also add their parents, who are identified by name in the Ontario marriage registrations from 1869 on, and I look for the spouse's family in the census preceding their marriage, to get the ages of the parents, and to identify any siblings. I try to push each family to the limit of the documentation.

Then I start a new odd numbered research stage by picking a new set of documents which has a low completion percentage.

Analysis of English Parish Records

English Parish Records are well preserved back to the reign of Elizabeth I because the Church of England is a part of the government of England, and its records were treated with the same care as taxation and court records. When I studied the ancestors of my paternal grand-mother [Ethel Clara Wilton \(10 August 1889—20 April 1983\)](#), I found a number of my relatives and others who were connected to this family had been at work before me. There were two competently organized family trees, which disagreed with each other in significant ways. So I decided to create my own from the parish records of Bruton, Somerset, a transcription of which was available on a CD from Global Genealogy. So rather than treating the tree as it appears on my site as gospel, the following is the formal analysis which I performed in order to construct the tree.

One systematic issue with working from parish records is that almost all marriages are performed in the wife's parish. Further a large proportion of births of first children take place at the home of the wife's parents for a number of obvious reasons. So working from the transcription of a single parish will result in missing information.

In this document I have sorted the record of baptisms, marriages, and burials into family order as far as the evidence justifies. Where both spouses are named as parents of a baptized child there does not appear to be any ambiguity. However where only the father is named there is a possibility that more than one individual of the same name was active in the same generation. I have assumed that as long as there is no more than a 10 year gap in a sequence of baptisms with the same father's name that it is the same individual. At the very least there is no way to distinguish individuals with the same name in the same generation, and families typically displayed little imagination when it came to naming their children. Using this technique shows no inconsistency with the record of marriages at Bruton. Burials with no other information than the name of the individual are difficult to correlate.

Marriage of **Thomas Wilton and Margaret** on 26.01.1556/7. Margaret was buried on 21.10.1588. Some of the unattributed children in the following list are probably from this marriage. Thomas is probably the individual buried on 24.10.1597 (implying age about 60 at death).

Marriage of **William Wilton to Edith Walter** on 09.10.1564. Edith was buried on 15.12.1622, identified as a Widow. There are 4 burials of a William Wilton in the years between 1564 and 1622 and there is no way from this evidence to tell which is of this William.

Marriage of **John Wilton and Elizabeth Ames** on 03.06.1563. Elizabeth was buried on 24.09.1627. John is probably the individual buried on 03.06.1627 as there are no other candidates in the Bruton records.

These three gentlemen all appear to be grandchildren of one George Wilton of Wyke, a village near Bruton, but the parish records do not run far enough back to permit their relationship, or even the names of their parents, to be determined.

Unfortunately during this period, essentially the reign of Elizabeth I, baptisms were registered with **no parent** specified. There is no obvious way to assign these individuals to any specific family as identified by the marriage records except to assume that children would be named after their parents, and that children are generally born in the first years of a marriage.

This group of children are clearly from the two separate marriages:

08.10.1598 Thomas Wilton to Avis Plimton

Since there is only one Thomas Wilton baptized during the preceding 30 years (on 02.03/1565/6), the most probable explanation is that Agnes died and Avis was a second wife. The death of the second wife is probably represented by the burial of "Anisse" Wilton 20.12.1632. Thomas may be the individual buried on 24.04.1639 (implying age at death about 70), although the burial of Thomas

Wilton "of Weeke" on 28.05.1615 (implying age at death about 45) cannot be excluded.

23.05.1591 ROGER Wilton S THOMAS Wilton

This may be the daughter XPIAN Wilton daughter of Thomas Wilton who was buried 04.04.1617. Note, however, that the name (which is an abbreviation for Christian, using the Chi-Ro as in Xmas) was reused by Thomas on 07.08.1613.

However there are a large number of children for the period and a daughter Edith is recorded 11 years after the marriage to Dorethe, and therefore presumably after the death of the[first] wife Edith. There is also a reuse of the name Agnes without an intervening record of a death.

This does not match any marriage at Bruton. However marriages are generally performed in the bride's parish if that is different from the husband's. This may be the Thomas Wilton baptized 09.07.1607. It may be the Thomas Wilton who died "suddainly" on 09.08.1677, although that may also be the Thomas Wilton baptized on 24.07.1625, since the adjective implies an unexpected death, and death would not be unexpected at age 70. This may also be the Thomas Wilton who died on 28.08.1679.

However as discussed below there must have been another William Wilton active in this generation.

The wife may be the Sybil Wilton buried 01.01.1841 at age 82, implying birth in 1759, but in that case Thomas & Pitman would have been born to her at age 45.

This may be the Elizabeth who was buried 23.01.1846 at age 72, although that would mean her last child was born when she was 43.
